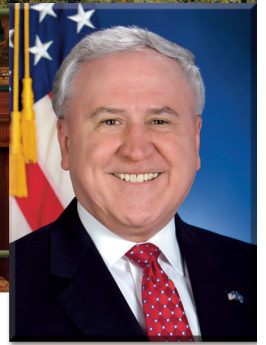

## State Senator John C. Rafferty, Jr.

### 44TH DISTRICT

*Berks, Chester and Montgomery Counties*

Senator John C. Rafferty, Jr. represents the residents of Pennsylvania's 44th Senatorial District, which includes parts of Berks, Chester and Montgomery counties. He was re-elected for a fourth term in the Senate in November of 2014. A former state deputy attorney general, the Montgomery County native has an extensive background in public service and local government. Rafferty's top legislative priorities include improving Pennsylvania's transportation system, lowering the property tax burden, protecting our environment, reducing health care costs, providing quality care for senior citizens, fighting drunk driving and prescription drug abuse and ensuring that our police and firefighters have the resources and tools they need to do their jobs.

Senator Rafferty serves as Chairman of the Senate Transportation Committee. In that capacity, he spearheaded passage of Pennsylvania's Transportation Funding Plan, Act 89 of 2013, to increase Pennsylvania's annual transportation investment by \$2.3 billion. The funding is being used to repair unsafe roads and aging bridges, undertake construction projects in congested areas and improve ports, rail lines and mass transit systems.

He serves as Vice Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, and is a member of Appropriations, Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure, and Law and Justice Committees. Senator Rafferty has been successful in bringing millions of dollars of funding to move forward with revitalization projects around the 44th district. He has legislatively addressed public/private transportation partnerships, the operations of landfills and brought local officials, community and business leaders together to seek common ground in improving our community's quality of life. Senator Rafferty has also fought hard for the protection of our children with his sponsorship of Jessica's Law and support of improvements to Megan's Law.

Senator Rafferty has received numerous accolades from various organizations in the 44th Senatorial District including 2005 Legislator of the Year Award for economic development from the TriCounty Area Chamber of Commerce in Pottstown, the

2006 Legislator of the Year Award from The Association of Retarded Citizens of Montgomery County, and the Taxpayer Hero Award from National Association of Independent Businesses. Additionally, Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) honored him with its 2013 Legislator of the Year Award.

Prior to running for the Pennsylvania Senate, Senator Rafferty served as an attorney in private practice, focusing on education, real estate, zoning and business and estates law. As Deputy Attorney General for the Commonwealth from 1988 to 1991, he worked in the Criminal Law Division.

Senator Rafferty has been active in local government, serving on various boards, authorities and commissions. As a member of the Lower Providence Township Board of Supervisors, he was involved with issues relating to growth and development, environmental protection and recreation improvements. He was a member of the Montgomery County Board of Assessment Appeals from 1996 to 2002.

Senator Rafferty also gained valuable knowledge of education issues as a member of the Methacton School Board from 1980 to 1984. From 1981 to 1984, Rafferty represented Methacton in the operation of the Vo-Tech School as a member of the North Montco Vo-Tech Joint School Authority.

Senator Rafferty earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown, his master's degree from Beaver College, and his law degree from Temple University.
