#### RACW BLIGHT RELATED GOALS

- Collaborate with municipal officials and key stakeholders to undertake activities to redevelop economically or environmentally challenged properties
- Implement programs to upgrade the existing housing stock and create additional affordable housing opportunities for low and moderate income households
- Collaborate with local governing bodies to promote multimunicipal planning and to plan and implement infrastructure and demolition projects in order to revitalize residential neighborhoods and commercial districts

## **Current Funding Sources**

- Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) –
   Reduced by 40% over the last five years
- Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) Reduced by 50% over the last five years
- Pennsylvania Housing Affordability and Rehabilitation Enhancement Fund (PHARE)
- Low Income Housing Tax Credits
- Act 137 Recording Fees
- Local Share Account (LSA) Gaming
- EPA Assessment Grants
- EPA Revolving Loan Fund



## **Home Improvements**

FY 2014 Budget - \$1.3 mil

### **Programs**

- Home Rehabilitation
   \$985k (CDBG, HOME, LSA)
- Access Program \$146k (DCED & Act 137)
- Homebuyer Assistance Program \$245k (HOME)



## **Home Rehabilitation Program**

- Established in 1977
- Benefits Low and Moderate Income Homeowners
- Improves Existing Housing Stock
- Increases Energy Efficiency
- Eliminates Code Deficiencies
- Reduces Lead Hazards
- Corrects Incipient Violations
- Over 2,300 Homeowners Assisted







## **Access Program**

- Established in 2005
- Benefits Low and Moderate Income Families
- Permanently Disabled Residents
- Increased Accessibility
- Modifications that Contribute to Independent Living





## Countywide Homebuyer Assistance Program

- Established in 2000
- Benefits Low and Moderate Income Families

- EQUAL HOUSING
- Purchase of Existing Home by a First Time Homebuyer
- 86 Families Assisted in Purchase and Renovation







## Highland Ridge Project



- Building 25 New Homes
  - -City of Washington
  - -52 Parcels Acquired
  - -22 Blighted Structures Demolished
  - -14 New Homes Constructed





#### **RACW Elderly Housing**


- 8 Facilities Developed, Owned and Managed
- 523 Total Units
- \$4 mil Annual Budget
- Annual Real Estate Taxes \$400k
- 19 Employees
- \$29 mil in Development





## Century Plaza Apartments

- North Franklin Township
- Building Opened in 1994
- Former Site Use Dilapidated Vacant Motel
  - •Purchased Out of Federal Bankruptcy Court
- Project Cost \$6.6 mil
- **79** Units







## Canon Apartments

- Canonsburg Borough
- Building Opened in 1998
- Former Site Use Blighted Area
- Project Cost \$4.5 mil
- 42 Units







## Claysville Apartments

- Claysville Borough
- Building Opened in 2007
- Former Site Use Blighted Area
- Project Cost \$4.9 mil
- 24 Units







## John Lignelli Manor

- New Eagle Borough
- Building Opened in 2002
- Former Site Use Vacant Mon Valley Hospital
- Developed by RACW
- Managed by the Washington County Housing Authority
- Project Cost \$4.1 mil
- 42 Units








#### **NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM**

- Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008
- Purchase and redevelopment of vacant foreclosed homes
- \$2.7 mil invested (\$1.5 mil grant, \$1.2 mil sales proceeds)
- Developers Threshold Housing Development & Mon Valley Initiative
- Purchase and rehab of 21 Properties sold to eligible buyers
- Targeted areas in City of Washington and Charleroi Borough







#### **SUMMERLEA AVENUE DEVELOPMENT**

- City of Washington
- Per RACW request, 7 dilapidated houses donated by Slovenian Savings and Loan
- CDBG funds used for environmental clean up and demolition
- Lots transferred to Threshold Housing Development for development
- HOME funds for construction two new single family homes
- Downpayment assistance loans provided to two eligible buyers in 2014







#### **CODE ENFORCEMENT DEMOLITION**

- Blight Removal National HUD Objective
- 343 blighted structures demolished Countywide since 2005
- \$3.4 mil in CDBG funds utilized since 2005
- \$262k in CDBG allocated for demolition FY 2015





#### **CODE ENFORCEMENT DEMOLITION**

- Municipality establishes demolition as priority
- Building Code Ordinance in place
- Blighted properties identified and cited by municipality
- Condemnation occurs if property is not brought up to code
- Properties released to RACW for demolition
- Demolition is last resort





#### **DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION**

City of Washington Central Business District Revitalization Project

- Completed in 2005
- \$13 mil invested
- 14 block streetscape project
- Scope included relocating utilities underground, new sidewalks, street paving, lighting, decorative benches, planters and trash receptacles

- Properties Selected for Environmental Site Assessments (ESA)
- Phase 1 & Phase 2 ESA (21 Sites)





# Brownfield And Loan Fund

- EPA \$1 mil Grant Capitalize RLF
- Loans Provided for Cleanup Activities
- Grant/Loan Combination Municipalities & Nonprofits
