AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal within
- the Department of Community and Economic Development; and
- 3 creating the Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal Advisory
- 4 Board.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 9 Business Permitting Portal Act.
- 10 Section 2. Intent and purpose.
- 11 It is the intent of this act and its purpose shall be:
- 12 (1) To provide one-stop services to assist businesses in
- identifying and securing appropriate permits, licenses,
- 14 certifications, applications, forms and registrations needed
- 15 to establish and operate a business in this Commonwealth.

- 1 (2) To establish the Pennsylvania Business Permitting
- 2 Portal to provide an electronic single access point to aid
- 3 existing and potential business owners in completing the
- 4 various business registration forms and permit applications
- 5 required to establish and operate a business in this
- 6 Commonwealth.
- 7 (3) To provide for the compilation of a comprehensive
- 8 listing of all permits required by Commonwealth agencies and
- 9 categorize the required permits into a format that is readily
- 10 available to business owners.
- 11 (4) To promote efficient dialogue between permit
- 12 applicants and the Commonwealth agency responsible for the
- 13 review of permit applications.
- 14 Section 3. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 "Commonwealth agencies." Any office, department, authority,
- 19 board or commission of the Executive Department of the
- 20 Commonwealth.
- 21 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 22 Development of the Commonwealth.
- "Individual business account." A secure online account
- 24 maintained by the Department of Community and Economic
- 25 Development to store individualized information relating to a
- 26 business's activities through the permitting portal.
- 27 "Local permitting authorities." Any municipality or
- 28 municipal authority which has the authority to issue a permit.
- 29 "Permit." The whole, part or the renewal of any permit,
- 30 certificate, license, approval, registration, charter or any

- 1 other form of permission issued by a Commonwealth agency to
- 2 allow for the operation of a business in this Commonwealth.
- 3 "Permit application." Any request to a Commonwealth agency
- 4 which is necessary to obtain a permit.
- 5 "Permitting portal." The Pennsylvania Business Permitting
- 6 Portal established under section 4.
- 7 "Secretary." The Secretary of the Community and Economic
- 8 Development.
- 9 Section 4. Establishment of the Pennsylvania Business
- 10 Permitting Portal.
- 11 (a) Establishment.--The department shall establish the
- 12 Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal to provide a single
- 13 online access point to aid existing and potential business
- 14 owners in completing the necessary permit applications
- 15 associated with establishing and operating a business in this
- 16 Commonwealth.
- 17 (b) Permitting portal functions. -- The permitting portal
- 18 shall, at a minimum, allow for the following:
- 19 (1) The creation of an individual business account to
- store general information on the business, which will be used
- 21 to automatically fill in recurring fields on a permit
- 22 application.
- 23 (2) The electronic submission of a permit application.
- 24 (3) The electronic submission of permit fees or fines.
- 25 (4) The tracking of status of payments from Commonwealth
- 26 agencies to contractors.
- 27 (5) The tracking of pending permit applications.
- 28 (6) The recording of electronic signatures.
- 29 (7) Access to customized, agency-created to-do
- 30 checklists specific to the individual business account.

- 1 (8) Online interaction with the department to resolve
- 2 difficulties with the permitting portal.
- 3 (9) Online interaction with Commonwealth agencies to
- 4 resolve questions relating to permit applications.
- 5 (10) The protection of the confidentiality of all
- 6 information submitted through the permitting portal.
- 7 (11) The recording of backup records of all activities,
- 8 including time-stamp information on the submission of permit
- 9 applications.
- 10 (12) The listing of information relating to local permit
- 11 application information for relevant local permitting
- 12 authorities.
- 13 Section 5. Cooperation between the department and Commonwealth
- 14 agencies.
- 15 (a) Permit identification. -- The department shall coordinate
- 16 with the Commonwealth agencies to identify permits that are:
- 17 (1) Appropriate for inclusion in the permitting portal.
- 18 (2) Compatible with or that may be made compatible with
- 19 the permitting portal.
- 20 (b) Cooperation. -- The department and Commonwealth agencies
- 21 shall cooperate in good faith to integrate the maximum number of
- 22 permits into the permitting portal.
- 23 Section 6. Preservation of Commonwealth agency authority.
- 24 (a) Existing regulatory authority. -- This act shall not
- 25 supersede any regulatory authority granted to any Commonwealth
- 26 agency.
- 27 (b) Existing permit authority. -- A Commonwealth agency listed
- 28 on the department's portal shall maintain final authority to do
- 29 the following:
- 30 (1) Determine the permits appropriate for inclusion on

- 1 the permitting portal.
- 2 (2) Approve or deny permits according to applicable law.
- 3 (3) Determine the requirements for submission and
- 4 payment of permit application fees and fines.
- 5 Section 7. Liability.
- 6 This act shall not impose any liability on the department
- 7 resulting from the operation of the permitting portal.
- 8 Section 8. Pennsylvania Business Permitting Portal Advisory
- 9 Board.
- 10 (a) Establishment.--There is established within the
- 11 department an advisory board known as the Pennsylvania Business
- 12 Permitting Portal Advisory Board.
- 13 (b) Duties.--The board shall advise the department on ways
- 14 to ensure that the permitting portal system is operated in an
- 15 effective and user-friendly manner for existing and potential
- 16 business owners.
- 17 (c) Membership. -- The board shall consist of seven members as
- 18 follows:
- 19 (1) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development
- 20 or his designee.
- 21 (2) One member appointed by the President pro tempore of
- the Senate.
- 23 (3) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 24 Senate.
- 25 (4) One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 26 Representatives.
- 27 (5) One member appointed by Minority Leader of the House
- of Representatives.
- 29 (6) One member appointed by the Governor representing
- 30 small business.

- 1 (7) One member appointed by the Governor representing
- 2 business or industry.
- 3 (d) Chairperson. -- The secretary or his designee shall serve
- 4 as the chairperson. The board may elect additional officers as
- 5 it deems necessary.
- 6 (e) Terms.--Members shall serve without compensation at the
- 7 pleasure of the respective appointing authority, but shall be
- 8 reimbursed for expenses.
- 9 Section 23. Effective date.
- 10 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
