Amends the Local Option Small Games of Chance Act to further provide for increased prize limits, regulation and licensing, reporting, training, use of licensed premises, advertising and penalties.

BILL SUMMARY

Topic(s):	Increased prize limits, regulation of games, licensing and other provisions
Date:	September 23, 2011

Summary:

Senate Bill 444 provides for increased prize limits for games of chance and it enhances the regulation of games of chance. It also makes changes regarding licensing and the use of licensed premises. The bill allows the advertising of prizes and increases penalties for violations of the act. Various editorial changes are made throughout. Detailed provisions are as follows:

Prize Limits and Game of Chance Provisions

- The maximum cash value that may be awarded for any single chance is increased from \$500 to \$1,000.
- The weekly prize limit for a licensed organization is increased from \$5,000 to \$20,000.
- The prize limit for raffles is increased from \$500 to \$1,000.
- A licensed organization is permitted to hold more than one daily drawing per day.
- Progressive games with a maximum cash value of \$5,000 are permitted (new).
- Insured games backed by a valid insurance contract are permitted (new).

Regulation and Accountability

- Prize winnings required to be reported to the Internal Revenue Service are required to be reported to the Department of Revenue.
- The license of an eligible organization shall be revoked or not renewed if it has failed to keep and maintain records required by this act for two years.
- A licensed organization shall have a separate bank account to hold the proceeds from games of chance. Account records showing all income and expenditures shall be retained by the licensed organization for two years.

- A licensed organization shall file with the licensing authority an annual financial report containing detail regarding games of chance, including receipts, expenses, prizes and use of the proceeds. The most recent annual report shall be filed with an application to renew the liquor license of a licensed organization.
- A licensed organization shall certify completion of at least four hours of games of chance training every two years. Training must be completed by the executive officer, secretary or a responsible person of the eligible organization. Training requirements do not apply if the eligible organization does <u>not</u> conduct games of chance on 60 or more days during the licensing period.
- A criminal history record information check is required to be obtained from the Pennsylvania State Police for the executive officer or secretary of the eligible organization and all other responsible persons listed on the application for a license.
- The application for a games of chance license shall include an affidavit that the eligible organization:
 - Complied with the annual financial report filing.
 - Has a separate bank account to hold all proceeds of games of chance.
 - Complied with the training requirements

Licensing and Licensed Premises

- The term of the license is changed from annual to biennial (2 years).
- The licensing fee is changed from \$100 annually to \$300 on a biennial basis.
- The limited occasion license fee is changed from \$10 to \$30.
- More than one licensed eligible organization may use the same location. Each eligible organization shall have its own license, and the prize limitations shall apply separately to each licensed eligible organization.
- The prohibition on leasing premises from any person who has been convicted of a violation of this act within the past ten years is expanded to include the prohibition of the leasing of premises from any person who has violated the Bingo Law within the past ten years.
- A licensed eligible organization is permitted to sell on its licensed premises the raffle tickets of another licensed eligible organization that has been issued a limited occasion license.

Advertising

• The advertising of games of chance prizes and their dollar values is permitted. The advertisement shall contain the date, time, location, whether cash or merchandise prizes will be awarded and the name of the licensed eligible organization and name of the person who conducts the games of chance.

Penalties

• The maximum penalty for violations of the act is increased from \$1,000 to \$2,000.

Applicability and Effective Dates

- Provisions regarding affidavits on the licensing application, the filing of annual financial reports and background checks shall apply to applications for a license filed more than one year after the effective date.
- Provisions relating to the term of the license, licensing fees, license application, financial reporting and training and background checks take effect immediately.
- The remainder of the act shall take effect in 60 days.

17	Section 1. Section 2 of the act of December 19, 1988
18	(P.L.1262, No.156), known as the Local Option Small Games of

20	Section 2. Legislative intent.
21	The General Assembly hereby declares that the playing of
22	small games of chance for the purpose of raising funds, by

certain nonprofit associations, for the promotion of charitable
 or civic purposes, is in the public interest.

3 It is hereby declared to be the policy of the General Assembly that all phases of licensing, operation and regulation 4 of [small] games of chance be strictly controlled, and that all 5 laws and regulations with respect thereto as well as all 6 7 gambling laws should be strictly construed and rigidly enforced. The General Assembly recognizes the possibility of 8 9 association between commercial gambling and organized crime, and 10 wishes to discourage commercialization of [small] games of chance, prevent participation by organized crime and prevent the 11 diversion of funds from the purposes herein authorized. 12 13 Section 2. The definitions of "daily drawing," "games of

14 chance," "raffle" and "weekly drawing" in section 3 of the act, 15 amended or added December 19, 1990 (P.L.812, No.195) and October 16 18, 2000 (P.L.602, No.79), are amended to read:

17 Section 3. Definitions.

18 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 19 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 20 context clearly indicates otherwise:

21 * * *

"Daily drawing." A game of chance in which a bona fide 22 23 member selects or is assigned a number for a chance at a prize 24 with the winner determined by [a] random drawing to take place 25 on the eligible organization's premises [during the same 26 operating day]. The term includes games of chance commonly known as "member sign-in lotteries" and "half-and-half lotteries." 27 28 Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit the carrying over of a jackpot where the winning number has not been entered 29 30 in the game of chance on a particular operating day. Daily

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drawing winners may be determined with the aid of a passive 1 2 selection device or reference to drawings conducted by the 3 department pursuant to the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law. Daily drawing chances 4 may not be sold for an amount in excess of \$1, and no more than 5 one chance per individual may be sold [to an individual during 6 the same operating day.] per drawing. Nothing in this definition 7 8 shall be construed to restrict a licensed eligible organization from conducting more than one drawing per day. 9

11 "Games of chance." Punchboards, daily drawings, weekly drawings, raffles and pull-tabs, as defined in this act, 12 13 provided that no such game shall be played by or with the 14 assistance of any mechanical or electrical devices or media 15 other than a dispensing machine or passive selection device and 16 further provided that the particular chance taken by any person in any such game shall not be made contingent upon any other 17 18 occurrence or the winning of any other contest, but shall be 19 determined solely at the discretion of the purchaser. This 20 definition shall not be construed to authorize any other form of gambling currently prohibited under any provision of Title 18 of 21 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to crimes and 22 offenses) or authorized under 4 Pa.C.S. (relating to 23 24 <u>amusements</u>). Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize

25 games commonly known as "slot machines" or "video poker."

27 "Raffle." A game <u>of chance</u> in which a participant buys a 28 ticket for a chance at a prize with the winner determined by a 29 random drawing of corresponding ticket stubs to take place at a 30 location and date or dates printed upon each ticket. Such games

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<u>of chance</u> shall include lotteries but not daily drawings. Raffle winners may be determined by reference to drawings conducted by the department pursuant to the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law.

5 * * *

"Weekly drawing." A game of chance in which a bona fide 6 member selects or receives a number or numbers for a chance at a 7 prize with the winner determined by a random drawing to take 8 place on the licensed eligible organization's premises at the 9 10 end of a seven-day period. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit the carrying over of a jackpot where the 11 winning number has not been entered in the game in a particular 12 13 week. Weekly drawing winners may be determined with the aid of a 14 passive selection device or reference to drawings conducted by 15 the Department of Revenue pursuant to the act of August 26, 1971 16 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law. Weekly drawing 17 chances may not be sold for an amount in excess of \$1.

Section 3. Section 5 of the act, amended December 19, 1990 (P.L.812, No.195) and October 18, 2000 (P.L.602, No.79), is amended to read:

21 Section 5. Prize limits.

(a) Individual prize limit.--[The] <u>Except as provided for in</u>
<u>subsection (i), the</u> maximum cash value which may be awarded for
any single chance shall be [\$500] <u>\$1,000</u>.

(b) Weekly limit.--No more than [\$5,000] <u>\$20,000</u> in cash or
merchandise shall be awarded by any <u>licensed</u> eligible
organization in any seven-day period.

(c) Limit on raffles.--No more than \$5,000 in cash or
merchandise shall be awarded in raffles in any calendar month.
(d) Exception.--[An] <u>A licensed</u> eligible organization may

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1 conduct a raffle and award a prize or prizes valued in excess of
2 [\$500] <u>\$1,000</u> each only under the following conditions:

3 (1) The licensing authority has issued a special permit4 for the raffle under section 11.

5 (2) [Eligible organizations] <u>A licensed eligible</u> 6 <u>organization</u> shall be eligible to receive no more than two 7 special permits in any licensed year except that volunteer 8 fire, ambulance and rescue organizations shall be eligible to 9 receive no more than three special permits in any licensed 10 year.

13 (4) The total cash value of all prizes shall be no more14 than \$100,000 per calendar year.

(e) Limit on daily drawings.--Daily drawings shall be governed by the prize [limitations] <u>limitation</u> contained in [subsections (a) and (b)] <u>subsection (a)</u>. [An eligible organization shall not conduct daily drawings during a period when a weekly drawing is taking place.]

20 (f) Exception.--The prize limitation contained in [subsections (a) and (b)] subsection (a) may be exceeded by a 21 daily drawing under the following circumstances: a daily drawing 22 23 may award a prize where the cash value is in excess of [\$500] 24 \$1,000 if such prize is the result of a carryover of a drawing 25 or drawings which resulted from the winning number in such 26 drawing or drawings not being among the eligible entrants in such drawings. Nothing contained herein shall authorize the 27 28 prize [limitations] <u>limitation</u> as contained in [subsections (a) 29 and (b)] subsection (a) to be exceeded as a result of a failure to conduct a drawing on an operating day during which chances 30

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were sold for a daily drawing or for a daily drawing for which
 chances were sold in excess of \$1 or for which more than one
 chance was sold to an eligible participant.

4 (g) Daily drawing and weekly drawing exception.--When a
5 daily drawing or weekly drawing is set up or conducted in such a
6 manner as to pay out or award 100% of the gross revenues
7 generated from such drawing, the limitations contained in
8 subsection (b) shall not apply.

9 (h) Limit on weekly drawings. --Weekly drawings shall be 10 governed by the prize limitations contained in subsection (b). The prize limitation contained in subsection (b) may be exceeded 11 by a weekly drawing under the following circumstances: a weekly 12 13 drawing may award a prize where the cash value is in excess of 14 [\$5,000] <u>\$20,000</u> if such prize is the result of a carryover of a 15 drawing or drawings which resulted from the winning number or 16 numbers in such drawing or drawings not being among the eligible entrants in such drawings. Nothing contained in this act shall 17 18 authorize the prize limitations as contained in subsection (b) 19 to be exceeded as a result of a failure to conduct a drawing for a week during which chances were sold for a weekly drawing or 20 for a weekly drawing for which chances were sold in excess of 21 22 \$1. [An eligible organization shall not conduct weekly drawings 23 during a period when a daily drawing is taking place.]

(i) Progressive games of chance.--Progressive games of
chance shall be permitted with a maximum cash value of \$5,000.
Contributions to the pot shall be counted against the limit for
the week in which the contribution is made except that when the
limit is reached the amount awarded shall be counted toward the
limit only to the extent it was not previously counted toward a
prior week's limit.

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1	(j) Definitions For the purpose of this section,
2	progressive games of chance are games of chance in which a
3	winning ticket awards the ticket holder an additional chance at
4	another game of chance or games of chance.

9 Section 10. Licensing of eligible organizations to conduct10 games of chance.

11 License required. -- No eligible organization shall (a) 12 conduct or operate any games of chance unless such eligible 13 organization has obtained and maintains a valid license issued 14 pursuant to this section. Auxiliary groups within a licensed 15 eligible [organizations] organization shall be eligible to 16 conduct [small] games of chance using the license issued to the 17 eligible organization provided that the auxiliary group or 18 groups are listed on the application and license of the eligible 19 organization. No additional licensing fee shall be charged for 20 an auxiliary group's eligibility under this act. 3 (b.1) Location of [small] games of chance.--Where there exists a location or premises which is the normal business or 4 5 operating site of the eligible organization and is owned or 6 leased by that eligible organization to conduct its normal business, that site shall be the licensed premises for [small] 7 8 games of chance conducted by the licensed eligible organization. If that location consists of more than one building and the 9 10 licensed eligible organization wishes to conduct its games in a 11 different building at that location from the one that is listed 12 on its application for a license and on its license, the 13 licensed eligible organization must notify, in writing, the 14 district attorney and the licensing authority of the change in 15 building site and the dates and times that will be affected. 16 When [an] a licensed eligible organization does not own or lease a specific location to conduct its normal business, that 17 18 <u>licensed</u> eligible organization may use another <u>licensed</u> eligible 19 organization's premises to conduct its games of chance or may 20 make such other arrangements that are consistent with this act, 21 including, but not limited to, leasing a premise under a written agreement for a rental which is not determined by either the 22 23 amount of receipts realized from the playing of games of chance 24 nor the number of people attending except that an eligible organization may lease a facility for a banquet where a per head 25 26 charge is applied in connection with the serving of a meal. When such eligible organization changes the site of its games of 27 28 chance from that which is listed on its application for a 29 license and on its license, the licensed eligible organization must notify, in writing, the district attorney and licensing 30

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1 authority of the change in their [games'] <u>games of chance</u> site
2 and dates and times that will be affected. <u>More than one</u>
3 <u>licensed eligible organization may use the same location</u>,
4 <u>provided that each eligible organization has its own license and</u>
5 <u>that the prize limitations of this act shall apply separately to</u>
6 <u>each licensed eligible organization</u>.

7 (b.2) Off-premises games of chance.--Notwithstanding any 8 other provisions of this section, [an] a licensed eligible organization may conduct [small] games of chance at a location 9 10 off its premises when such games of chance are part of an annual 11 carnival, fair, picnic or banquet held or participated in by 12 that licensed eligible organization on a historical basis. The 13 licensed eligible organization must notify, in writing, the 14 district attorney and licensing authority of the location, date 15 and times of such events where it will be conducting [small] 16 games of chance.

17 (b.3) Limited occasion licenses.--Eligible organizations 18 which do not own their own premises or which do not lease a 19 specific location to conduct their normal business may apply for 20 a limited occasion license to conduct [small] games of chance on not more than three occasions covering a total of seven days 21 during a licensed year. A limited occasion license entitles an 22 23 eligible [organizations] organization holding [such a] the 24 license to conduct no more than two raffles during a licensed 25 year where prizes may not exceed the established limits for 26 regular monthly raffles. Holders of limited occasion licenses may not apply or be granted any other license or special permit 27 28 under this act. No holder of a regular license or special permit 29 under this act shall apply or be granted a limited occasion 30 license.

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1 (b.4) Gambling facility prohibited.--It shall be unlawful 2 for a person, corporation, association, partnership or other 3 business entity to offer for rent or offer for use a building or facility to be used exclusively for the conducting of [small] 4 games of chance. It shall also be unlawful for any eligible 5 organization to lease under any terms a facility or building 6 7 which is used exclusively for the conducting of [small] games of 8 chance.

9 (c) Display.--Licenses issued pursuant to this section shall 10 be publicly displayed at the site of the [small] games of 11 chance.

12 (d) Operation.--Each licensed eligible organization shall 13 [comply with the following restrictions and rules governing the 14 operation of games of chance] <u>be prohibited from the following</u>:

(1) [No] <u>Permitting any</u> person under 18 years of age [shall be permitted] to operate or play games of chance.

(2) [No eligible organization shall permit] <u>Permitting</u> any person who has been convicted of a felony in a Federal or State court within the past five years or has been convicted in a Federal or State court within the past ten years of a violation of the act of July 10, 1981 (P.L.214, No.67), known as the Bingo Law, or of this act to manage, set up, supervise or participate in the operation of games of chance.

(3) [No eligible organization shall pay] <u>Paying</u> any
compensation to any person for conducting any games of
chance. Games of chance may only be conducted by managers,
officers, directors, bar personnel and bona fide members of
the eligible organization.

29 (4) [Games shall be conducted only] <u>Conducting games of</u>
 30 <u>chance on any premises other than</u> on the licensed premises or

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1 as otherwise provided by this act.

2 (5) [The eligible organization shall not lease such] 3 Leasing the licensed premises under either an oral or a written agreement for a rental which is determined by either 4 5 the amount of receipts realized from the playing of games of 6 chance or the number of people attending, except that an 7 eligible organization may lease a facility for a banquet 8 where a per head charge is applied in connection with the 9 serving of a meal. (d.1) Sale of raffle tickets.--

10 (1) A licensed eligible organization may sell on its 11 licensed premises the raffle tickets of another licensed 12 eligible organization that has been issued a limited occasion 13 license under subsection (b.3).

14 (2) Raffle tickets may be sold off the licensed premises 15 in any municipality in this Commonwealth which has adopted the provisions of this act by an affirmative vote in a 16 17 municipal referendum. A licensed eligible organization which 18 plans to sell raffle tickets in a municipality located in a 19 county other than the county in which the licensed eligibile 20 organization is licensed must notify that county's district attorney and licensing authority as to the location and the 21 22 dates that the licensed eligible organization plans to sell 23 raffle tickets. 24 (d.2) Bank account and records. -- The licensed eligible 25 organization shall keep a bank account to hold the proceeds of 26 games of chance, which shall be separate from all other funds 27 belonging to the licensed eligible organization. 8 played has adequate means of ingress and egress and adequate
9 sanitary facilities available in the area.

10 The eligible organization is not leasing such (3) premises from the owner thereof under an oral agreement, nor 11 12 is it leasing such premises from the owner thereof under a 13 written agreement at a rental which is determined by the 14 amount of receipts realized from the playing of games of 15 chance or by the number of people attending, except that an 16 eligible organization may lease a facility for a banquet 17 where a per head charge is applied in connection with the 18 serving of a meal.

19 (4) The eligible organization has complied with the
 20 annual financial report filing.

21 (5) The eligible organization has a separate bank
 22 account to hold all proceeds of games of chance.

23 (6) The eligible organization has complied with the
 24 applicable games of chance training requirements.

29	(ii) The training shall have been completed by the
30	executive officer, secretary or a responsible person

1 listed on the application for a license of the eligible organization. The person receiving the training shall be 2 associated with the conduct of games of chance by the 3 eligible organization. 4 5 (iii) The training shall consist of the completion of training materials prepared by the department. The 6 training materials shall be designed to assist eligible 7 organizations in their compliance with statutory and 8 9 regulatory reguirements associated with the conduct of 10 games of chance. The training materials shall be available on the department's publicly accessible 11 12 Internet website. Upon request, the department shall 13 provide hard copies of the training materials at a cost 14 not to exceed the actual cost of printing and postage. 15 (iv) This paragraph shall not apply if the eligible organization submits an affidavit affirmed by the 16 17 executive officer or secretary of the eligible 18 organization that the eligible organization will not 19 conduct games of chance on 60 or more days during the 20 licensing period. 21 (f) List of licensees.--The licensing authority, on a semiannual basis, shall send a copy of all licensees to the 22 23 Department of Revenue. 24 List of municipalities. -- The licensing authority shall (q) 25 include with any license or renewal license issued to an 26 eligible organization, an up-to-date listing of those municipalities within the licensing county which have approved 27 28 the referendum question on [small] games of chance. 29 (h) Background checks.--Each application for a license shall include the results of a criminal history record information 30 20110SB0444PN0625

27 Election to be held. -- In any municipality, an election (a) 28 may be held on the date of the primary election immediately 29 preceding any municipal election, but not more than once in four years, to determine the will of the electors with respect to the 30

Where an election shall have 3 been held at the primary election preceding a municipal election in any year, another election may be held under the provisions 4 5 of this act at the primary election occurring the fourth year after such prior election.
