

SENATE OF PENNSYLVANIA BILL SUMMARY

Senate Bill 178 Printer's No. 170

Prime Sponsor: Senator Scavello and Senator Scarnati Committee: State Government

SYNOPSIS:

Amends Title 37 to update and modernize the History Code (Code).

SUMMARY:

Amends the Code relating to administration of the State Archives, archival records and other areas by:

- 1. Adding definitions for Archival Records, the State Archives and State Archivist, Record and Public Record.
- 2. Removing provision requiring preparation of an annual report relating to the Conservation Center by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission (PHMC), which PHMC no longer operates.
- 3. Modernizing the sale and disposition of property as well as adding language on abandoned property on loan to the PHMC.
- 4. Adding language that the State Archives shall be the official repository for the permanent and historically valuable public records of the Commonwealth.
- 5. Adding sections on the protection and recovery of historical Commonwealth and local government records.
- 6. Prohibiting the sale or transfer of Commonwealth archival records unless authorized by law or established by approved Commonwealth record retention procedures; provides a civil penalty of not more than \$2,500 for a violation of this provision.
- 7. Opening access to older public records after 75 years, unless specifically prohibited by law.
- 8. Removing from the Code certain historical properties that the PHMC either has transferred or sold to other entities.

Effective Date: 60 days.

Similar versions have been introduced in prior legislative sessions, including Senator Robbins' Senate Bill 1253, which in 2014 unanimously passed in the Senate (48-0).
