#### Senate Urban Affairs Public Hearing

The City of Reading is fortunate to have Albright College and Alvernia University, both located in low density residential neighborhoods. Around 2002-03 the student population at Albright began to increase faster than the college could build additional on-campus housing and within a few years, student rentals began to grow within this primarily owner-occupied neighborhood. At this same time the College Heights Community Council (CHCC) was also organizing and growing. The CHCC is located within the 17-7 and 17-8 Precincts within Senatorial District 11 and the House 126<sup>th</sup> District and is composed of approximately 870 households with approximately 200 contributing members. The housing plan for this area was drawn in 1912 as a low density (R1 and R2) residential neighborhood. The homes are a mix of semi-detached and detached homes. The majority of the homes in this area are detached dwellings. Home values run from approximately \$80,000 for semi-detached to \$150,000 plus for detached dwellings.

By 2005 the College Heights area went from primarily owner occupied to almost 50-50 rental/owner occupied properties and the majority of the rental properties became off campus housing for 3, 4, 5 and 6 Albright students. The complaints for police and codes services increased proportionately, especially over weekends. A number of long standing residents sold their homes and left Reading because they could not take the student behavior problems such as students urinating in bushes, parties that did not end until well after 2 am (weekends and week nights), bottles, cans and cups littering the streets, students throwing up on front lawns, etc.

Officials at Albright stated that they could not control the behavior of students who lived off campus. They refused to recognize the problem and residents began to complain to the City. Around 2006, as City Clerk I was asked by City Council to work with our Zoning Office and Law Department to research how other college communities handle off campus student housing problems.

Our research showed that college students are not in a protected class and limitations on the number of students residing in a home could be used. Our original ordinance limited the number of students per household to three (3), if a landlord wanted more than three, he would need to obtain a Special Exception zoning permit from the Zoning Hearing Board. The ordinance also states that there cannot be more than one approved student home within 800 feet of another. This ordinance was based on an ordinance previously enacted in West Chester. The College Heights community has managed to block the approval of any additional student homes in our neighborhood. City Council also enacted a Disruptive Conduct Ordinance to address the problems at rental properties. If two Disruptive Conduct Reports are issued to a rental property within a 12 month period, the landlord is required to evict the tenants.

While the City and the neighborhood thought the problem was solved, the City quickly realized that enforcing this limitation on the number of students per household was nearly impossible for two reasons:

- 1. The Zoning Enforcement Officer needs to prove that there are more than three students residing, not "visiting" or "sleeping over" at a property.
- 2. When the landlord limits the number of students in a home to three, the students often invites one to two additional students to move in (without informing the landlord) to share expenses.

In 2010 the City amended the zoning ordinance to prohibit any additional student homes in low density residential zones (R1 and R2), except in existing multi-unit properties.

As you consider the request of the investors/landlords to minimize or eliminate the restrictions on student housing, you also need to consider:

- 1. College students do not fall within the protected class. The Fair Housing Act, which is the federal law governing housing discrimination, includes the following seven protected classes: race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, and familial status.
- 2. Investors/landlords believe renting a single family home is a "by right" use in the Municipalities Planning Code (MPC); however, that is a myth as the MPC does not include provisions for the rental of single family homes.

- 3. Single family rental properties are commercial businesses. Landlords are required to obtain a local business license, pay local business privilege tax along with state and federal tax on their rental property income.
- 4. Investors/landlords say that regulating single family rentals in zoning ordinances would result in a "taking" of a property; however, the zoning ordinances are meant to regulate uses in various zoning districts. The MPC only requires a municipality to allow each use type in at least one zoning district in the municipality.
- 5. In 2011 the City of Reading started a Quality of Life Ticketing Ordinance and in one year 67% of the tickets issued were to rental properties.
- 6. The City of Reading has approximately 28,000 residential properties and 17,000 are rental units.
- 7. Pennsylvania has 2,563 municipalities (excluding Philadelphia and Pittsburgh). There are 241 colleges and universities in Pennsylvania (excluding Philadelphia and Pittsburgh) in approximately 123 communities that are 3<sup>rd</sup> Class-sized cities and smaller. The majority of these municipalities are like Reading and the colleges and universities are located in low density residential zones.
- 8. Investors/landlords do not reside in the neighborhoods they invest in. Therefore they are not truly invested in the property or in the conditions of the neighborhood.

I have lived in the Albright area since 1968, when my parents moved to Reading from an outlying suburban area. I purchased my first home in this area and subsequently purchased and moved into two other homes in this same neighborhood. I personally saw this neighborhood go from a community that was quiet, stable and secure to a neighborhood that has become stressed. This stress, which I call "The Creep", started with the slow and steady increase of single family rental properties in this neighborhood.

The irreconcilable difference between permanent and temporary housing and owner occupied and rental housing is that temporary and rental housing uses are for profit. By definition, rental units are businesses that generate a service fee paid to the investor.

Conversion of owner-occupied businesses is a Reading problem and a State-wide problem and is increasing in the current recovering real estate market as investors purchase foreclosures and convert them to rental housing. This problem destroys neighborhoods and causes owner occupants to move away from Pennsylvania's cities. This is not a small and isolated issue. The cumulative effect has caused the continued degradation of Pennsylvania's neighborhoods and the long term decline of Pennsylvania's cities.

So I suggest the following: rather than move legislation that will improve conditions for investors/landlords, create and adopt legislation that will improve conditions for neighborhoods like mine. Amend the MPC to define single family rentals as "Commercial" properties, which is what they truly are.

I live in an R2 low density residential zone. If I were to move and decide to rent my home, then I would need to obtain a business license and pay business privilege tax, because, by making my house a rental property, I would have created a business.

Zoning codes regulate various types of uses in various areas "to protect the character and well being of private and public property,", "to avoid the undue concentration of population," and to minimize the impact incompatible uses have on neighborhoods. Zoning is used to group complimentary uses and prevent conflicting purposes. Clearly, the conversion of single family owner-occupied homes to single family rental homes is conflicting. Single family rentals are the only use not regulated in the MPC. If you want to save 2,563 municipalities you will correct that omission in the MPC.
