Drug & Alcohol Restrictive Intermediate Punishment (D&A RIP)

ABOUT D&A RIP

Restrictive Intermediate Punishment (RIP) is a more severe form of Intermediate Punishment (IP), designed to provide for strict supervision of the offender. RIP is a direct sentencing alternative to incarceration for non-violent, Level 3 and 4 offenders. All offenders undergo a diagnostic assessment of dependency on drugs and alcohol. Those assessed to have dependency issues participate in clinically prescribed intensive drug and alcohol (D&A) treatment as part of their RIP sentence.

D&A RIP FY 10/11 INTAKE COMPLETION RATIO

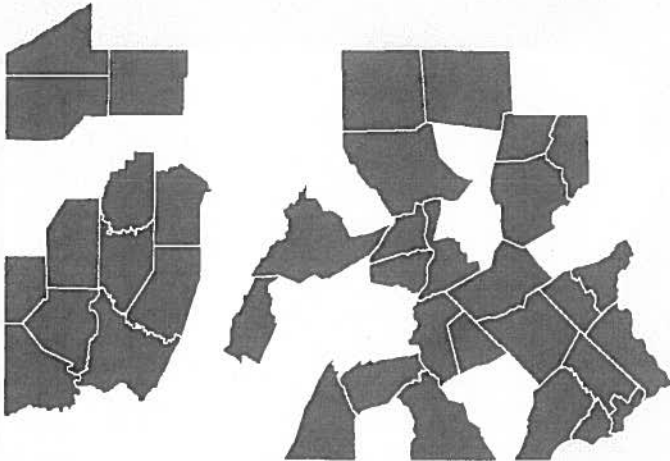

Offender intakes had a completion rate of around 80%.

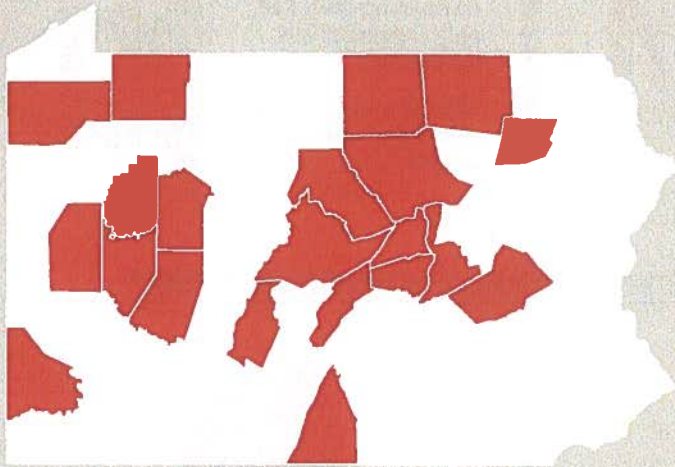

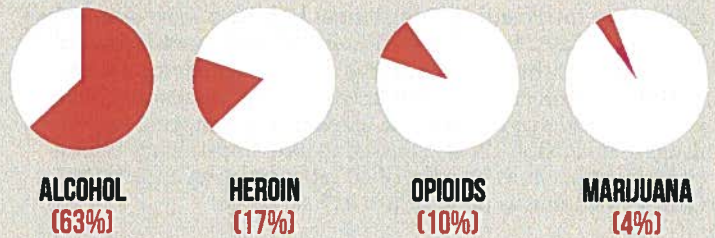

RURAL COUNTIES RECEIVING FY 13/14 D&A RIP FUNDING

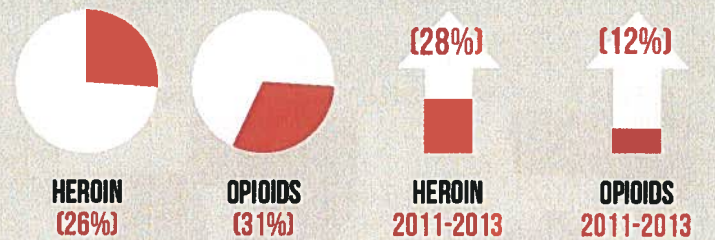

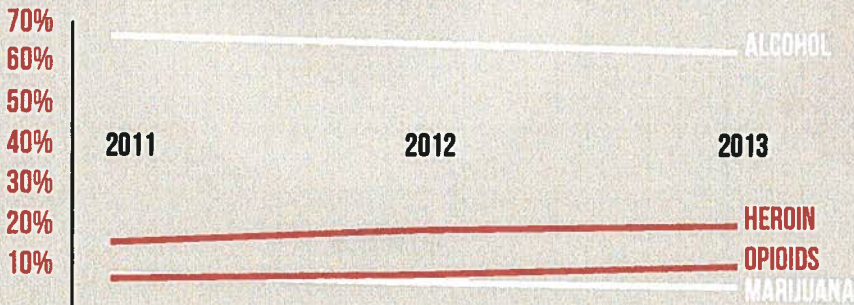
OFFENDER DRUG OF CHOICE - 3 YEAR AVERAGE



HEROIN & OPIOID DEPENDENCY - 3 YEAR AVERAGE



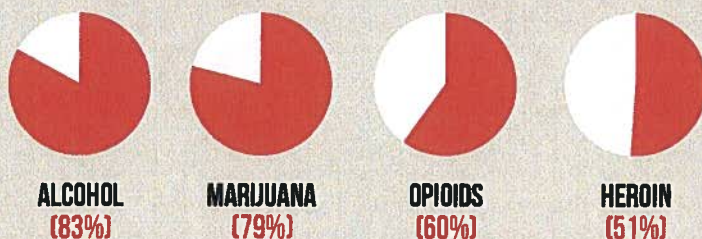
